

The Institutional Journey: From North to the Mid-South A Foundation of Integrity

The church presence in Memphis is not an isolated event. It is the culmination of a decade of administrative excellence and spiritual warfare across the great lakes and Midwest. To move is to evolve, to relocate is to deploy resources to where the need is greatest.

The Northern Administrative Corridor (2014-2025)

Before the Memphis relocation and expansion in the Bible belt began, our leadership governed from the industrial hearts of Michigan and Illinois. The church has done operations in Philadelphia and Atlanta as well.

- **The Chicago Outpost (3353 W 13th Place):** The church just started out. The church hosts meetings and services at the location in 2014 and 2015. The church started small with fewer members and grew to a large congregation years later to 13,404 members today. Our spiritual womb. Here the doctrine where members were refined. The church staff and advisors at the time hosted Homelessness Prevention Roundtable meetings each month in the Douglass Park neighborhood. The church still has records of the previous meeting minutes and agendas. The church was able to help the homeless with financial assistance and personal care kits to the homeless and needy. The church held our administrative meetings at the location and used the location as a coworking space before church operations in meeting rooms.
- **The Pontiac Sector (1051 Arlen Avenue):** A hub for community outreach where we learned to navigate the rubble of urban decay and turn it into a garden of faith.
- **The Flint Executive Office (615 Saginaw Street):** Located in the historic Ferris Wheel Building, this office served as the administrative war room. It provided corporate integrity and professional infrastructure required to scale a national vision.
- **The Philadelphia Executive Office (1900 Market Street):** this office served as the administrative war room. Workshops and events took place at public meeting rooms for free or by rental fee.
- **The Atlanta Executive Office (1447 Peachtree Street Northeast):** this office served as the administrative war room. The church staff and advisors have hosted meetings and conducted some church administrative operations while services took place at Public auditorium areas in Atlanta, such as Georgia State University and public library community rooms. Workshops and events took place at public meeting rooms for free or by rental fee.
- **The Detroit Executive Office (400 Renaissance Center, 2600):** this office served as the administrative war room. The church staff and advisors have hosted meetings. Workshops and events took place at public meeting rooms for free or by rental fee.

The Memphis Church (2026-Present)

In early 2026, the signal led to church leadership, yeah to the heart of the mid- south. While spectators look at the past and think they know it all about everything, we are leaving our work boots for the future.

- **The New Church/Headquarters (594 Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Ave):** this 26,600 square feet building and facility is currently undergoing renovations and zoning approval process to make sure we can do church operations out of the industrial building to convert to a church and

sanctuary for church operations. The site will serve as a premier hub for Sunday worship, Bible study services, administrative operations, community outreach programs for the needy and homeless.

- **The Houston Executive Office (9100 Gulf Freeway):** office served as the administrative war room. The church staff and advisors have hosted meetings. Workshops and events took place at public meeting rooms for free or by rental fee. Sunday Services and Bible study services are taken place at public meeting rooms or space for free or in public places that require a rental fee.
