Ezekiel 34:11 Genesis 1:1 1 Peter 5:2

Say we must have the privilege to serve God. When I previously preached on selecting your twelve disciples for your inner circle, we need to do what Ezekiel did with and speak to Jesus in Ezekiel 34:11. I am doing what Ezekiel and Jesus are saying to do in Ezekiel 34:11. As my time in homelessness and homeless shelters, it is like I search for a flock and sheep to seek people out. It explains my personality as an introvert. It explains why I am easily friendly with homeless people while I was staying in homeless shelters in Detroit, Houston and Atlanta. It seems like I establish better friendships with homeless people in homeless shelters like I was at Atlanta Mission, Oasis-Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries, Detroit Rescue Mission and Atlanta Mission. It seems like I established better relationships and friendships in shared room housing in the past before the Star of Hope Mission in Houston. The housing is more christian based with weekly bible study and people pray and meditate on the bible daily. Last time I lived in shared room housing in the past with bible study sessions and more christian based in Detroit in March-August 2017. I was able to make friends with people easily at the Star of Hope Mission in Houston after I got into the Spiritual Recovery Program. I make friends with homeless people at homeless shelters around the world. I believe that it is what God and the Holy Spirit is doing to me to guide me to meet new people. I believe that is probably how the spirit led me to meeting people Pastor John Johnson, program managers, Mr. Gray,-my case manager, Charles Nowlin, Mr. Allison and other clients at the Star of Hope Mission in Houston while I was in the Spiritual Recovery Program. It seems like I connect with those types of people spiritually because homeless people in Detroit, Houston and Chicago told me face-to-face that I motivate them spiritually and economically. Homeless people tell me I motivate them to build themselves up spiritually in Chicago, Detroit, Houston, New York City, Atlanta and Cleveland. When I

was a client in the Spiritual Recovery Program at Star of Hope Mission during evening chapel services from other pastors, I will have a detailed story to tell people about myself after I leave Star of Hope Mission in Houston.

I found out from Philly House staff about my prayers during their prayer team motivates them as a volunteer on Mondays at the Philly House in Philadelphia. Ezekiel 34:11 talks about my privilege to God and my spiritual gift in exhortation, evangelicalism and shepherding. Ezekiel was a major prophet to Jesus. As an ordained Bishop of this congregation, I see myself as a major prophet to Jesus. It seems like I am like Ezekiel because I hear Jesus speaking to me daily while I speak to him daily. This week I provided 33 prayers to homeless men at the Philly House as a volunteer for the Prayer team. I provided 55 total prayers to homeless men at the Philly House this month to utilize my strong spiritual gifts in shepherding, evangelicalism, exhortation and wisdom. I volunteer at homeless shelters to perform my volunteer experience spiritually. I do not volunteer at homeless shelters to try to seek work experience for any future employment.

We need to do and apply Philippians 4:6 to our life daily to strengthen ourselves, evangelicalism and privilege to God. We do not need to pray less for things from God. We need to pray to God for everything in our life to heep on the path of righteousness. Homeless men and women need to pray for everything to God every morning to ask Jesus what should do and accomplish for today to serve your kingdom and lift me up in your kingdom. People need to apply Philippians 4:6 to their life before you decide to live in abomination to God. We need to pray and confess everything to God to keep us on the path of righteousness. Say to the person next to you: we must have the privilege to serve God and pray to God daily. We must serve and honor God honestly and righteously.
