It is time we need to start raising our children in God's truths and spirit. It is time for me to take our children's life more seriously while they are babies to children to teens. I encourage parents to start taking their children to church as toddlers because they will guarantee to grow out of it and become active churchgoers and grow up to learn the bible. When toddlers get home from childcare everyday, they need to start reading the bible at home for one hour to study and help children at age 3-5 to understand the bible and living a righteous life to God is important for them while they move on in their life. Children need to pray with their parents every morning before childcare and afternoon after childcare. Children need to pray with their parents before bed by praying different prayers. 12. What fears do you have about letting go and trusting God with your children as they grow, and how can you surrender those fears to God?

“Train up a child in the way he should go: and when he is old, he will not depart from it.”-Proverbs 22:6

Parents are encouraged to live out godly morals in front of their children. Parents need to be consistent in their training and correction, providing children with practice in a godly lifestyle. The goal is to lay a solid foundation of faith, so that when children are older, they can rely on that teaching.

When I was a child, I had people that tried to get me to do things to fit in with them or tried to take advantage of my kindness. I never tried to fit in with people when I was a teen because I was cautious who to become friends with. I was never friends with people that were directing me down the path to be ungodly and sinful as some people in my school were. I just stayed focused on my academics and graduated from high school on time and planned out my goals to go to college. When I was a child, I felt comfortable being raised by my mother and biological father because I would have a better social life

right now. My mother, step-father and mother side of the family told me as a child to be myself. I did that, but go into a shy mold and cannot open up to people like other people with a social life. That's why I can talk to my friend GJay because I feel like I could open up to him to be myself. I felt lost as a child because I felt my sister had a better childhood and social life than I had. I was the one that went to school as shy and spoke with a speech impediment. I feel like people had to come to me and become friends. I could not and was not able to go to them. My sister had more friends to come home with her to handout and I did not have that. It explains that today that I was never able to invite guests over to my apartments in the past in Iowa and Michigan in 2018 and 2016, I believe I was not raised that way as a child and my biological father told me in Las Vegas that he believes I was raised wrong as a child. He says that he wished that he was in the household to help raised to be better than I am now with a social life, but he said my mother did not want to wait on him because they were both young and lived with their parents. I did not have a clear passion for anything as a child because family told me that being a lawyer did not fit me because I did not have skills and attitude for that career. God led me to preach and get my calling to start my own church in 2014.
