I do not lean on my own understanding after I completed the Spiritual Recovery Program at Star of Hope Mission in Houston.

The church will host weekly bingo fundraisers in October 2025 in Southeast Michigan and Flint. Our communities are divided today and people in our community live in sin because people are coming together as united like they are supposed to build strong and positive relationships. People need to start studying the scriptures and seeking guidance from God's word, and actively applying its teachings to our daily life. We need to start honoring God's word and make sure our principles are aligned with his kingdom. Involvement in the LGBTQ community is not honoring God's word, teachings and principles to the kingdom. It is an abomination to the kingdom.

I once tried to assemble a bookcase without reading the instructions thinking I can channel my inner carpenter. A pile of mismatched screws within two hours later and a wobbly structure of the bookshelf. I realized I just need the right guidance. We can expect to build the God kingdom effectively relying on our own strength. We need the Holy Spirit manual, so to speak and do it right.

I tried to bake a cake once, following a recipe my grandma swore was foolproof. Turns out, a pinch of salt to her is a whole tablespoon to me. The result was memorable, but not in a good way. It taught me that sometimes our own understanding just isn't enough. When it comes to living out of faith, we need the right ingredients and guidance from the Holy Spirit to make something truly amazing.

"For the kingdom of God is not a matter of talk but of power."-1 Corinthians 4:20

Paul was speaking to the church of Corinth about the nature of God's kingdom. The purpose of why Paul wrote the scripture to address issues and problems in the church in Corinth. It is still the same problems going on in the church and community today. It is the reason why you have seen terrorism take place in churches in the past in various cities including Chicago. There are still divisions and moral issues going on in our church today because people are still comfortable living in temptation, sin and bondage. You still have people in our communities that still love the world and live their life by the flesh. Jesus instructs his disciples to be his witnesses, promising them the power of the Holy Spirit to fulfill this mission. Jesus is speaking to the apostles about the Holy Spirit coming upon them to be witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and to the end of the earth. Empowerment refers to the Holy Spirit giving the apostles the ability, courage and spiritual gifts needed to share the message about Jesus and perform their mission as witnesses. Jesus instructs his apostles in Jerusalem and Judea, Samaria and the end of the earth. Jesus did what he did in the scripture so he can make sure the apostles are effective witnesses in different regions. We can pray for the empowerment of the Holy Spirit to share our faith, step out of our comfort zones in our communities, and support global missions.

“Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues[a] as the Spirit enabled them.”-Acts 2:2-4

As Christians and disciples, we are empowered by the Holy Spirit to live out our faith, share the Gospel and experience God's presence in our lives. It is an invitation to tap into that same power and let it transform us. The scripture is saying that we need to start letting the Holy Spirit work within us.

- Seek God's presence and ask for the Holy Spirit infilling.
- Be open to the spirit guidance and empowerment in our lives
- Use our gifts and abilities to serve others and share the gospel
- Live a life that reflects that love, joy and peace of the Holy Spirit.

“For the kingdom of God is not a matter of eating and drinking, but of righteousness, peace and joy in the Holy Spirit, because anyone who serves Christ in this way is pleasing to God and receives human approval.”-Romans 14:17-18

Paul discusses dietary restrictions and how Christians should approach them. Paul is saying that the essence of God's kingdom is not found in observing or abstaining from certain foods or drinks. Righteousness refers to being declared right with God. Paul is laying down wisdom on how to live together in peace and harmony. Paul is speaking to the Christians in Rome about division and judgment. Paul encouraged the Christians to focus on unity and love. The Christians of Rome were facing disagreements over things like eating certain foods and observing certain holy days. Some Christians felt strongly about following these practices while others believed they were no longer necessary. It led to tension and judgment within the church. The disagreements were about eating certain foods. Paul emphasized that the kingdom of God is not about these external practices. Those who serve Christ in the way of righteousness, joy and peace are pleasing to God and approved by others. These scriptures promote unity and understanding, urging believers not to serve one another over disputable matters. Ways to apply the scripture to our life is facing our core values on the path of righteousness, peace and joy. We can apply the scripture to our life to prioritize unity and avoid judging others over disputable matters, seeking to please God and be approved by others through your service and conduct.

“For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins”-Colossians 1:13-14

We are rescued from darkness as Christians and disciples. We are saved by God's grace as the kingdom of God. Redemption means we have been rescued from sin control and restored to a right relationship with God offering us freedom and new purpose. Paul was speaking to the Colossians. Forgiveness means in the scripture that sins are pardoned and removed.
