We want to prepare ourselves for the final judgment in heaven to make sure we have a clean and obedient heart to God and Holy Spirit. We want to make sure to obey all God's commandments in the bible and live our life in truth. Whatever we do on earth that God knows about. We want to defeat Satan and move him out of the way in your life to prevent sin and evil.

"Then I saw a great white throne and him who was seated on it. The earth and the heavens fled from his presence, and there was no place for them. And I saw the dead, great and small, standing before the throne, and books were opened. Another book was opened, which is the book of life. The dead were judged according to what they had done as recorded in the books. The sea gave up the dead that were in it, and death and Hades gave up the dead that were in them, and each person was judged according to what they had done. Then death and Hades were thrown into the lake of fire. The lake of fire is the second death. Anyone whose name was not found written in the book of life was thrown into the lake of fire."-Revelation 20:11–15

Satan will be cast into the lake of fire, where he will suffer torment forever and ever. The scripture describes a future judgment where the dead stand before God. Books are opened, and the dead are judged according to what is written in them. The Book of Life is also opened. People's names that are not in the book of life will not get eternal life.

"When the Son of Man comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, he will sit on his glorious throne. All the nations will be gathered before him, and he will separate the people one from another as a shepherd separates the sheep from the goats. He will put the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. Then the King will say to those on his right, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father; take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me. Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink? When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you? The King will reply, Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me. Then he will say to those on his left, 'Depart from me, you who are cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels. For I was hungry and you gave me nothing to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me nothing to drink, I was a stranger and you did not invite me in, I needed clothes and you did not clothe me, I was sick and in prison and you did not look after me. They also will answer, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry or thirsty or a stranger or needing clothes or sick or in prison, and did not help you? He will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did not do for one of the least of these, you did not do for me. Then they will go away to eternal punishment, but the righteous to eternal life."-Matthew 25:31–46

This parable comes to an end of a section where Jesus taught his return and the judgment followed. It was presented as prophetic revelation rather. All nations gathered before the Son of Man. God separated the people while placing the sheep on his right and the goats on his left. The righteous inherit the kingdom of God. The kingdom of God has been prepared for them since the foundation of the world. The acts of mercy are not the cause of salvation. The acts of mercy are not the cause of salvation. We need to show mercy to the vulnerable in tangible ways as part of worshiping God. The way to show acts of mercy is feeding the hungry, giving drinks to the thirsty, welcoming strangers, clothing the naked, caring for the sick, and visiting prisoners in your daily life. The way to show acts of mercy is volunteering at a soup kitchen, donating to a food bank, and/or starting a community garden. We need to be friendly with everyone while meeting new people. We need to offer help for people in need and avoid neglecting people. If you do not have the money to help people at the time that we need to be honest with them and say you do not have it to give. Christians and disciples donate clothing to organizations and shelters and give clothing to people on the street. If you have a loved one in the hospital or nursing home, you need to visit them to show love for them. Those who are not righteous are sent away into eternal fire.

I started volunteering for the campaign in October 2007 while I was volunteering for Barack Obama Presidential Campaign in the

I volunteered for Barack Obama Presidential campaign starting June 2012 after the Republican and Democratic Conventions. I was involved and a member of the Rainbow Push Coalition in 2014. I was a member of Catholic Charities Junior Board in Chicago. I was a member of the Volunteer Committee, Faith Committee and Social Committee of the Catholic Charities Junior Board in Chicago in 2012-2014. As a member of Catholic Charities Junior Board in Chicago, I served and advocated for the needy and homelessness in Chicago. I was a member of the National Action Network in 2021-2022. I created the Homelessness Taskforce as a member of the National Action Network. I was a member of Access Living of Metropolitan Chicago advocating for people with disabilities in 2014-2015. I was a volunteer at Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries-Oasis, Genesis House II and Community Christian Center in 2017 through 2018. I helped feed the homeless men, women and veterans. I was a volunteer at Grace Place in Chicago serving and feeding over 300 homeless and needy every Saturday morning in 2015. I performed work therapy at Star of Hope Mission in Houston working in the facility serving lunch or dinner to clients, and custodial work in 2023. I was a volunteer at Philly House in 2024 serving lunch and dinner to the homeless. I was a volunteer of the Philly House Prayer Team. I have been a faith partner for Bill WInston Ministries since 2018. I have been a prayer partner for the Helping Up Mission in Baltimore since 2024. I have certificates from the Depaul Leadership Institute in 2010, such as Leadership of the Workplace, Organization Leadership Certificate, and Social Responsible Leadership Certificate. I started the Pastor Hobson Homelessness Initiative in 2010-2014 to give back to the community to help the needy and homelessness. Also, I had another personal grassroots project in Chicago while I started and founded the congregation. The personal grassroots project was called the Youth and Children Community Development Initiative. Pastor Hobson Homelessness Initiative was a personal grassroots project in Chicago. I started the America Homelessness Initiative in Dubuque, IA in 2015 to help and serve the homeless. I was volunteer case manager at The City Mission in Cleveland in 2017. I was a dayroom mentor that provided guidance to homeless men. When I was a child and teenager growing up in Chicago, my grandmother discussed her Sunday school lesson with me every Saturday night over her house. She was a Sunday school teacher for several years. I went to fellowship gatherings and events at her church. I gained my spiritually for her and my biological side of the family as a child. My mother's side of the family was not spiritual as a child because I only went to church on Easter Sunday. When I volunteer at homeless shelters. I do it spiritually because I am a cheerful giver for the poor and homelessness. I have donated over \$3,000 for the homeless since 2014. I have personally donated food and clothing to the homeless.

"But the day of the Lord will come like a thief. The heavens will disappear with a roar; the elements will be destroyed by fire, and the earth and everything done in it will be laid bare."-2 Peter 3:10

This verse is part of a larger passage written to combat mockers who deny Jesus's promised return. Peter addresses mockers who question the timing of Jesus's return. Peter counters this by reminding readers of God's power to create and destroy. The Noahic flood was evidence of God's willingness to judge the world. The heavens will pass away with a loud noise. The basic components of the universe are consumed and disintegrate. As christians and disciples, we should live with a sense of readiness and urgency. We must understand that the world will one day be consumed. We must live each day as if Christ could return at any time in our life. Our faith and obedience in God need to be a top priority in our life to be able to get eternal life at the gates of heaven. People that continue to sin in their life are not making serving God as their top priority. Believers are urged to live holy and godly lives by finding a church home, attending church services and bible study every week, going to Sunday school, getting involved in a ministry, reading and applying the bible to our life daily, and attending fellowship gatherings at church. Believers recruit their 12 disciples like Jesus did and grow to maintain the inner circle. We must not live

by leaning on our own understanding. We do not focus on material things and possessions on earth. We live to honor God in our life.

"This will take place on the day when God judges people's secrets through Jesus Christ, as my gospel declares."-Romans 2:16

Paul was speaking about God's judgment about the secrets of men through Jesus Christ. He explains that God judges outward and inner thoughts. Paul writes about a future day when God will judge people's hidden actions through Jesus Christ. The verse addresses those who are called Jews. Paul's point is that external knowledge of the Law is not the same as internal obedience and that a person's true standing before God.

We need to stop judging others and start judging themselves. Too many people in the world like to judge others and act like instigators towards other people. People need to stop assuming things about other people thinking they know it all. People need to start focusing on themselves. We need to start focusing on ourselves and what we are doing in our life. We must live honestly and live out what is right. We must live our spiritual journey with transparency. We must admit and confess our faults. We must renew our minds for God. God's judgment is based on truth and deeds. God looks at the heart.

I had some mental health problems as a child. I was not raised in a Christian household as a child. I grew up in a household where my stepfather spoke with a lot of profanity. My sister and I never attended church on Sunday and never attend Sunday school. My sister and I grew up in a disciplined household. My mother spoke to my sister and I as a child as well. The only time I went to church was when I spent the night over my grandmother's house on my biological father's side of the family on the south side of Chicago. I was baptized and born again on September 4, 2011 and got my calling to preach later as a pastor. I started the personal grassroots project called the Pastor Homelessness Initiative that provided evangelicalism and helped the homeless in Chicago. I became a member of Salem Baptist Church of Chicago and completed the new members program in June 2014. I was involved with the Pastor Care Ministry after I completed the new members program. I volunteered to help the homeless on the southside of Chicago once a week with my involvement in the Pastoral Care Ministry. I was involved in the Celebrate Recovery program while I was involved in the Pastoral Care Ministry at Salem Baptist Church of Chicago. I attended church every week in Dubuque, IA and attended potluck socials at the church in 2015 through 2016. I attended Zion Hope Church in Detroit in 2017 through 2018 for their services. I attended Rock Church of Atlanta in 2020. Pastors told me that I needed to be affiliated with a church while managing my own congregation. I attended Riceville Mount Olive Baptist Church in Houston in 2023. I became a member of the church in 2023. I attended Sunday school class at Riceville Mount Olive Baptist Church in Houston. I boasted in my knowledge of the Bible and was quick to point out the failings of others. I used to make decisions out of pride and ambitions. I do not do that any more. I used to think and make decisions too fast and never took my time to make life decisions. When I moved out of Chicago in September 2015, I moved to Iowa and had my own apartment. I lived in Dubuque for sixteen months. I was getting by okay financially and economically. I moved to Detroit in late January 2017. I started out at Detroit Rescue Mission and moved to Highland Park, Michigan for three months. I moved to the Westside of Detroit for three months in 2017. I moved to Cleveland in August 2017 to January 2018. I attended a church every week in the West Cleveland neighborhood while I was living in Cleveland. I moved back to Detroit in January 2018. I started out at Detroit Rescue Mission Ministries-Oasis and moved in a studio apartment in late January 2018 to October 2018. I moved to Philadelphia in November 2018. I started out at Sunday Breakfast Rescue Mission that is now called

Philly House in 2018. I moved to the North Philadelphia neighborhood in February 2019 and moved to West Philadelphia in March 2018 to December 2019. I moved to Pittsburgh in January 2020 to mid-February 2020. I moved to Louisville in February 2020. I moved to Atlanta in March 2020 to May 2020. I moved back to Detroit in May 2020 on the west side of Detroit in the Warrendale neighborhood to December 2020. I moved back to Atlanta in January 2021 to November 2021 in the Decatur neighborhood. I moved back to Louisville in November 2021 to December 2021 in the West End area. I moved to Chicago in January 2022 to February 2022 in the Englewood area. I moved to Southwest Detroit in February 2022 to August 2022 then I moved to Riverview, Michigan in August 2022 to December 2022. I moved to East Detroit in January 2023. I moved back to Atlanta living in the Decatur neighborhood in February 2023 to April 2023. I moved to Houston in May 2023 to February 2024. I moved to Philadelphia in February 2024 to June 2024. I moved to Baltimore in October to November 2024. I moved to Charlotte in December 2024. I moved to Northwest Baltimore in January 2025 to February 2025. I moved to New York City in July to August 2024. I moved to New York City in April 2025 in the downtown Manhattan area. I moved to Louisville in May 2025. I moved to Grand Rapids, Michigan in June 2025. I moved back to Detroit in July 2025. I decided to settle myself in Detroit long-term. I still consider myself as 99% Christian as a man of God and ordained Bishop. I attended a church in the Bronx every Sunday in July to August 2024. I did not attend church in Grand Rapids, Michigan because I just read the bible daily. I attended church services and bible study while I was living in Charlotte, North Carolina at Victory in Jesus Christ Ministries. I did not attend church in Philadelphia because I was worried about my own congregation operations. I was living in Trenton, New Jersey in February or March 2025.
