We can obtain citizenship in God's kingdom by not just knowing who Christ Jesus is. The only way we can have citizenship in the kingdom is by strong faith and obedience to God. Another way is not living in wickedness and being a positive person to people on earth. We can obtain citizenship in heaven by just being born again or human achievement, we must have strong faith in Christ Jesus and obedience to the kingdom in our daily life. "Jesus replied, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God unless they are born again. How can someone be born when they are old?" Nicodemus asked. "Surely they cannot enter a second time into their mother's womb to be born! Jesus answered, Very truly I tell you, no one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit."-John 3:3-5

Jesus was speaking on the necessity for being born again to see and enter God's kingdom. Jesus was speaking to Nicodemus. Nicodemus was a member of the Jewish ruling council. Jesus was in Judea when he was speaking to Nicodemus about being born again. Nicodemis is a Pharisee as well. Nicodemus came to Jesus at night to speak to him about his preaching, teaching and authority. We need to understand going to heaven and being a Christian is more than having outward religious observance or good deeds. When we read this scripture, it means it is time for us today to turn away from sin and stop loving the world and possessions in the world. It is time for us to turn to God and serve God with obedience. When you decide to be baptized and be born again, it means you want to love and serve God with compassion and righteousness. It means no more being sinful, judgemental towards others thinking you know everything, worry about your own life and destiny, not trusting the world.

"Then Jesus came to them and said, All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."-Matthew 28:18

The scripture is called and part of the great commission. Jesus was speaking to his disciples after the resurrection. Jesus has been given all authority after he died and rose again during the resurrection and great commission. Jesus explains to his disciples in the scripture that he has the authority over everything and everyone on earth. That's why I say we need to examine ourselves and what we do on a daily basis. I will continue to communication about women and young women staying away from clubs and wild parties to avoid rape and unexpected pregnancies. That is not how women need men in their life to become soulmates. Women need to save themselves until the right man comes along to spend eternity and have a family. I strongly believe what my biological father says. Why did the citizens of heaven refuse to pay earthly taxes? Because he said, "my citizenship is in heaven and I am waiting for my upgrade package."

"For he has rescued us from the dominion of darkness and brought us into the kingdom of the Son he loves, in whom we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins."-Colossians 1:13-14

Paul was speaking to the Colossians of Jesus Christ. Paul was reminding them that they had been rescued from dominion of darkness and brought into God's kingdom. Colossians of Jesus Christ had redemption and forgiveness of their sins. In this scripture, the colossians of Jesus Christ were rescued from slavery to sin and payments through ransom. During this time in this scripture, the Colossians at this time believed in Jesus Christ and and transferred from the dominion of darkness into God's kingdom of the child of God. We all need to seek God to be rescued from our sins, living in bondage, temptation, idolatry and abomination. We all need to work on saving our souls for the good and stop living in sin and the darkness in our life. We need to do that by putting ourselves on a media fasting to stop watching TV and movies. It will stop us from being influenced by the world and loving the world. God wants to rescue people from the power of darkness because we need to stop living in sin and ungodliness. It is time for all of us to unite to accept God's redemption and forgiveness for our sins to avoid hell and end up like Lucifer in the bible that got rejected out of heaven. How do we need to apply the scripture to our life daily?

- 1. Accept Jesus Christ as our personal savior
- 2. We need to believe his sacrifice paid the price for our sins.
- 3. We must believe Jesus redeemed us by dying for our sins.
- 4. We need to start living as citizens to God's kingdom with heavenly and Godly wisdom
- 5. We need to start turning away from earthly wisdom.

- 6. We need to let Christ Jesus guide us with our values and decisions to prevent us from leaning on our own understanding.
- 7. We need to allow God to help us guide our actions
- 8. We need to start embracing the freedom we will have in Christ and stop living by the flesh and the darkness.
- 9. We need to start sharing our Godly testimonies and redemption to God and his kingdom about what God has done for you in your life in bad and tough times including helping you through trials and tribulations.
- 10. We need to start inviting people to come to church with us after people find their church home that they can be loyal to and get involved in spiritually to perform Godly workmanship in their communities.

"Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and strangers, but fellow citizens with God's people and also members of his household, built on the foundation of the apostles and prophets, with Christ Jesus himself as the chief cornerstone."-Ephesians 2:19

Paul was talking about and explaining that new believers have with God and with each other in Christ. What this scripture is telling us is we are no longer outsiders as Christians and disciples. Paul explains in this letter we are citizens of God people and children of God. Paul says in the letter that we are part of God's house now as Christians and disciples. The only time we can be part of God's house is having strong faith and obedience to God. As Christians and disciples, we belong to God and his family to eternal life in heaven and under his grace. As a God family, we are allowed to live with unity and harmony on earth without sinning. Paul was talking to the Gentile Christians in Ephesus telling them they are not excluded from God's people. We are saints and members of God's household. Paul wanted to break down barriers between Jews and Gentiles by promoting unity, reconciliation and shared identity among believers from different backgrounds. Paul wanted the Jews and Gentiles to be part of one body with equal access to God's grace and blessings. As a man of God and Bishop of this flock, I am honest and make sure on a daily basis that I keep my heart and mind whole for God by cleaning my heart during my Christisn walk in the Holy Spirit and Christ. I may still apologize to God for my weak contentment when I cannot make decisions and having trouble making decisions that cause me to still be unsure of myself.

"But you have come to Mount Zion, to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem. You have come to thousands upon thousands of angels in joyful assembly, to the church of the firstborn, whose names are written in heaven.-Hebrews 12:22-23

Mount Zion represents Jerusalem. Mount represents a heavenly place for believers for living and dead. It embodies God's kingdom.

"Then I saw "a new heaven and a new earth," for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and there was no longer any sea. I saw the Holy City, the new Jerusalem, coming down out of heaven from God, prepared as a bride beautifully dressed for her husband. And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Look! God's dwelling place is now among the people, and he will dwell with them. They will be his people, and God himself will be with them and be their God. He will wipe every tear from their eyes. There will be no more death or mourning or crying or pain, for the old order of things has passed away."-Revelation 21:1-4

I want to say to you this the first time I preached in the book of Revelation in a long time. John is speaking to future Christians and all future readers of this book of Revelation. John is promoting and providing the message about the new heaven and new earth. John promotes hope for the new heaven and the new earth. We want to hold onto our citizenship for heaven because we should be in the new heaven and earth with God that there is no more death, mourning, crying or pain. John was on the island of Patmos.

"On his robe and on his thigh he has this name written: And I saw an angel standing in the sun, who cried in a loud voice to all the birds flying in midair, "Come, gather together for the great supper of God, so that you may eat the flesh of kings, generals, and the mighty, of horses and their riders, and the flesh of all people, free and slave, great and small."-Revelations 19:16

King of kings means above all earth rulers. The Lord of Lords means that Jesus is the master of everyone. The scripture was talking about the return of Jesus. This scripture talks about the power of Jesus' power, authority and divine nature as he comes to judge and rule. This is the scripture that Jesus decides the fate of individual actions as the ruler and authority in his kingdom in heaven.
