Overcoming Doubt: Lessons from Peter Walking on Water

Story of Peter about his Faith in Jesus:

- Peter's initial step onto the water was a testament to his faith in Jesus.
- His faith wavered, and he began to sink.
- When Peter cried out to Jesus for help, he was immediately rescued.
- Peter's experience, though humbling, was not a condemnation.
- Even after Peter's initial failure, Jesus extended a helping hand.



Overcoming Doubt: Lessons from Peter Walking on Water

- Doubt can easily derail even the most promising beginnings.
- importance of turning to our source of strength and relying on God's grace in moments of doubt and fear.
- we will all face moments of doubt and that falling is not the end of the journey.
- We can learn from our mistakes and continue to grow in our faith.
- hope and reassurance that God's grace and mercy are always available to us, even when we stumble.
- Keep your eyes fixed on God and trust in His promises.
- Be aware of the subtle ways doubt can creep in and derail your progress.
- Seek guidance and support from God and trusted mentors.
- View failures as opportunities for growth and don't allow them to define you
- Remember that God's mercy and forgiveness are always available.

Things We Need to Learn from Book of Job

- God is ultimately in control, even in the midst of suffering.
- endurance and perseverance.
- trust in God's goodness and faithfulness.
- importance of maintaining faith in God, even when life throws unexpected challenges our way.



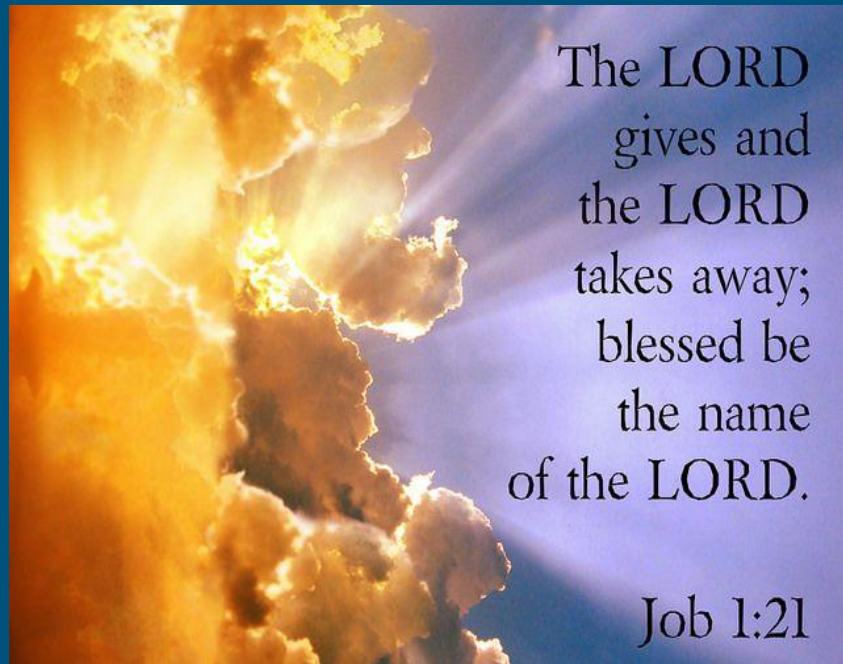

Story of Job:

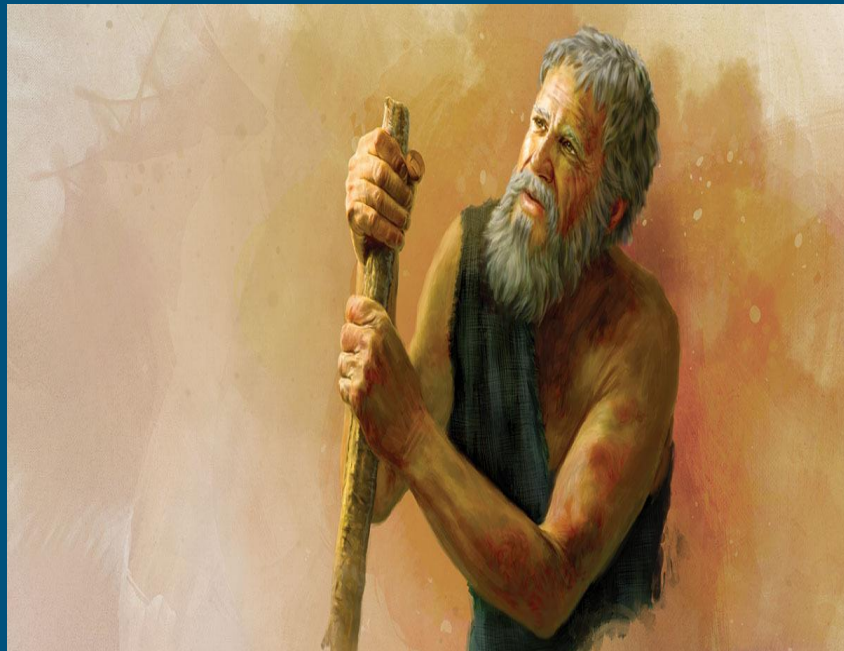
- Job never wavered in his belief in God's goodness and sovereignty
- Job grapples with questions about why the righteous suffer, expressing his doubts and frustrations to God.
- Job submits to God's will



God's Sovereignty: Lessons from Job Trials

Takeaways from the scripture that we need to apply to our life as Christians and disciples:

- God is in Control

God's Sovereignty: Lessons from Job Trials

- we can trust that God is ultimately sovereign.
- God's ways are often beyond human comprehension
- we don't always need to have all the answers to trust in God.
- trials can serve to refine our faith
- deepen our understanding of God, and draw us closer to Him
- and hope in His promises.

The Power of Patience: Job's Perseverance

- trusting God's timing.
- trust that God is working all things together for our good

Finding Hope in Despair: Job's Journey

- We must understand that we will lose our possessions during our trials. We must earning what we lost in our life by God and his kingdom. Letting God be our source is a good thing because we are not loving the world and/or being conformed to the world by living in sin, temptation, evil, darkness.
- People need to seek God and provide hope in themselves and stop panhandling people and families for money. We need to stop living like tax collectors and mammon in today society.
- Keep 100% contentment on God and the Holy Spirit

Trust God Wisdom: Insights from the Book of Job

- trust in God requires us to accept that there are things we may never fully understand.
- limitations of human wisdom and the danger of relying solely on our own understanding.
- true trust in God requires humility and a willingness to surrender our will to his.
- we can find opportunities for growth and gain wisdom that we might not otherwise have acquired.
- embrace humility, acknowledge our limitations, and ultimately submit to God's will.

- Job maintains his integrity and refuses to curse God.
- submits to God's sovereignty.
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
