The Diagnosis: Identifying the Static

The poverty spirit is a faulty foundation. It is characterized by three structural defects:

- **The Liar Mentality:** Believing you are always a tenant in life, subject to whims of others rather than Master Architect of your own destiny.
- **The Hate and Prejudice Spirit (Comparison):** Look what others have in jealousy rather than seeing it as a blueprint of what is possible for you.
- **The Disposable Standard:** thinking that you are in a small room, you do not have to follow the excellence code.
