Church Operations in State of Michigan



Congregation provided four donations to six homeless shelters organizations in Chicago and Detroit this year. Congregation became a partner of two churches this year in Illinois and Arkansas. Congregation pays partnership tithe to Bill Winston Ministries every month because Bishop Nicolas Hobson is a Faith Partner of Bill Winston Ministries. Congregation received application and application fee from one Small Business Program applicant this year to receive grant to start their own small business and become trained entrepreneur. Congregation added 900 members this year in United States of America. It has been more homeless people and low-Americans in United States of America joined the church. It was more homeless and low-income American men joined the church this year in United States of America. Congregation was in transition to Michigan this year from Illinois because we wanted to move to Michigan. Staff decided to keep homelessness and low-income community outreach in Illinois. Church moved to Michigan because congregation were having financial troubles in Illinois. Church has to propose budget cuts and operated under deficit spending in Illinois. Church had to close administrative office located in westside of Chicago. Church had to pay too many state and local government fees in Illinois. The process to start business in Illinois is too long of a process while other states have shorter process to start a business. Seven Democrats in the Illinois legislature oppose Bishop Nicolas Hobson legislation in 2015 to make it easier to start a business in Illinois. Most Illinois Democrats on southside of Chicago including State Representative Lashawn Ford oppose the legislation to make it easier to start business in Illinois.
