I did like Louisville because my living situation was not all that good there and I lived in poor shared room housing. I was able to work on job assignments with People Ready in Louisville. My living situation was not good and about average in Atlanta because I always ended downhill with my finances and ended up living in poverty. I always need family to help me financially send me money from Chicago. I did not do well financially in NYC because I always ended up living in poverty because of high prices of housing and living expenses. Baltimore was h
