Recent Activities:

The church's current membership is **13,886** that are extracted to the south from Michigan. The church gained **9 new members: 9 seeking a new church home joining the church as members based on their Christian experience.** The church attendance during services is **12,190+** every week to hear preaching from guest speakers and Bishop Hobson. The church gained new members looking to become a member and became involved in the church from **Tennessee and Texas.** More organizations and businesses are welcoming the congregation with open arms to escape the rubble and administrative static in Michigan. Bishop Hobson and church staff are ready to meet with city council and government agencies to move forward with the next step to do business with them.

Prayer Requests:

Prayers for families and communities in Minneapolis while the city is mourning for the ICE officer for shooting the woman in the face. Our prayers go out to the woman's family and her friends. Prayers will continue to go out to Bishop for his time of grief during his mom's loss. Prayers from Memphis residents reduce crime in their communities and prosperity among their families in their household. Some homeless people in Memphis and Houston seek prayer for their well being and seek God in their life. Some homeless people in Memphis and Houston are seeking prayers to help them deal with their mental health, anger and bipolar issues because those homeless people want to

get rid of their anger and bipolar disorders to be able to better take care of themselves economically and financially.

Announcements:

Bishop Hobson has removed and refreshed his Twitter and social media accounts to remove himself from national hashtags or other hashtags connected to Michigan. First Lady Jennifer doesn't do the same thing. They decided to make his Twitter and social media accounts more local in the south. Bishop Hobson will do more on-camera videos of devotion in the community like he did in Houston at transit hubs and/or national parks. All members and church operations have been extracted to the south and will not return to Michigan. The Volunteer to Work Program has transitioned and moved to Houston and Memphis. The church has taken place at temporary meeting locations and auditoriums in Memphis and Houston until the renovations are completed for new sanctuaries. The Contentment in Christ Leadership Conference has been dedicated to his mother with a legacy and dedication page that died on November 18, 2025. She would have been 63 years old on December 1, 2025. Funds of the \$4 million 2026 operating budget are starting to be allocated in Memphis and Houston to help the needy and homeless from ministries. Brandon Webb has been removed and replaced as elder of the church with an individual that lives a more spiritual life to God that does not smoke, speak with profanity and drink hard liquor. He was only an elder in training appointed by Bishop Hobson and Bishop realized elders did not fit him. After the extraction for members and operations to the south, the church has been gaining partnership opportunities with local businesses and organizations that want to do business with the church. My church staff tells Bishop Hobson that Trump continues to try to reach out to him to promote him as part of his

administration and MAGA. He ignores his outreach to him. Detroit has a history of shared room housing and not a lot of affordable housing. According to Economic Outlook in Detroit neighborhoods, it is more people in Detroit living in shared room housing properties that people rent rooms in homes that people have to share kitchen and bathroom. Most landlords except for a few in the East side are professional, not CIC Property Management because the leasing company represents a liar landlord. The church is preparing to file the 990N for 2025 so the form can be posted on the IRS website. Bishop Hobson will end wearing contact lenses for a while and start wearing prescription reading glasses from America Best in Memphis. When the church files the 990N by Vision Keepers for 2025, the church will have updated information on the tax form as Lord Jesus Christ Center as rebranding in the south. When the church 990N is approved by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), the approved letters label the church as an exemption organization as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization from the IRS.

As an ordained Bishop and person that likes to work, Bishop Hobson has important meetings set up for next week in the south for homeless outreach. The Legacy Blueprint: Building a Better You Seminars will have a financial benefit attached to the series that homeless people will receive financial assistance to pay for security deposit and first month rent for an apartment that ends their poverty and homelessness. Bishop Hobson will be preaching the seminars to homeless men and women at an organization in local communities. Black History Month events and gatherings are being planned next month. There will be workshops and prayer breakfast among members and the wider community next month in local communities. The investigation for CIC Property Management in Detroit will continue while Bishop Hobson is

living and settled in the south. The church programs has a six months proof of residency requirement in Tennessee and Texas according to the executive order that he signed two weeks weeks ago.
