Those who engage in it can have feelings of guilt. Gossip can create divisions and mistrust within communities. Gossip often involves exaggeration and distortion of facts. This can lead to the spread of false information and misunderstandings. Gossip can contribute to a culture of negativity and fear.

"Without wood a fire goes out; without gossip a quarrel dies down."-Proverbs 26:20

"Besides, they get into the habit of being idle and going about from house to house. And not only do they become idlers, but also gossips and busybodies, saying things they ought not to."-1 Timothy 5:13

The verse suggests that a lack of productive activity (idleness) creates an opening for harmful behaviors. When people have too much time on their hands, they may become preoccupied with the lives of others. That is why I support time limits and work requirements for SSI and SSDI benefits to stop idleness and people sitting at home with too much time in their hands. That is why I support entitlement programs that need work requirements to get people out of the house and start working again. Democrats want to expand entitlement programs so people in this country can sit at home and live with idleness. "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen."-Ephesians 4:29

This establishes a clear prohibition against harmful or destructive speech. This provides a positive alternative to negative speech. It emphasizes the importance of using words to encourage, support, and uplift others. Our words should have a positive impact on those who hear them. It is not enough to just not speak negatively. We must speak in a way that provides benefits. It encourages us to be mindful of our words and to speak with intention. We should consider the impact of our speech before we speak.

Those engaging in these behaviors are not ignorant of their wrongdoing, such as Wickedness, evil, greed, depravity, envy, murder, strife, deceit, malice, gossip, slander, God-hatred, insolence, arrogance, boastfulness, disobedience to parents, senselessness, faithlessness, heartlessness, ruthlessness. This underscores the idea that they are acting against their own conscience. It serves as a warning against the dangers of moral decay and the importance of adhering to ethical principles.

"A perverse person stirs up conflict, and gossip separates close friends."-Proverbs 16:28

Perverse implies a twisted or corrupt character, someone who deliberately acts against what is right or good. Gossipers may enjoy stirring up trouble or thrive on conflict. The active role some people play in generating conflict. It emphasizes the intimate relationships that are particularly vulnerable to the corrosive effects of rumors and slander. Separating close friends speaks to the deep betrayal and broken trust that gossip can inflict. It shows that gossip is very effective at destroying relationships. Behaviors have the power to damage relationships and communities. Gossip often operates in the shadows. The proverb underscores the importance of protecting and nurturing close friendships. This verse ties the actions of gossip and stirring up conflict to the character of the actors.

"Their lives became full of every kind of wickedness, sin, greed, hate, envy, murder, quarreling, deception, malicious behavior, and gossip. They are backstabbers, haters of God, insolent, proud, and boastful. They invent new ways of sinning, and they disobey their parents. They refuse to understand, break their promises, are heartless, and have no mercy. They know God's justice requires that those who do these things deserve to die, yet they do them anyway. Worse yet, they encourage others to do them, too."-Romans 1:29-32
