Open Hands: Stewardship with Kingdom Vision Image Bearers, Not Owners: Our Role as Managers

Our role as image bearers rather than owners highlights a theological and ethical framework where human beings are seen as stewards or managers of the world. Image bearers are responsible to a higher authority. The foundational belief is that God is the ultimate owner of all creation. Image bearers implies that humans are uniquely created in God's image and are tasked with reflecting His character in their management of creation. As image barriers, we must utilize our heavenly wisdom with wisdom from God, care and love others, perform creativity and justice in our actions as christians and disciples. We are given a mandate as Christians and disciples with the grace of God to work and take care of things. When you do not take care of things means you are letting the devil control you and want you to procrastinate on things and eventually not get things done. The same thing with debt in our life is work and taking care of it. I think about how the Democrats and Republicans talk about our national debt every election year or in Congress, but they fail to address how to work on reducing and taking care of our national debt. That's why we need to stop being dependable on the government and live for God at the center of your life with the grace of God. We need to read and familiarize ourselves with Genesis 2:15 that talks about working it and take care of it. That is one of the ways I look at Genesis 2:15 is working and taking care of things by managing our wisely. We must use our resources that God gives us wisely and make sure the resources we receive from heaven are sustainable in our life on earth before we talk about walking into heaven with our heavenly father and personal savior. Our role as managers fosters a sense of interconnectedness with all of creation. It shifts the focus from selfish consumption to a mindful

approach that considers the well-being of other people, animals, and the environment. These are questions you need to ask yourself and have in a journal:

- 1. What aspects of my life do I tend to view as 'mine' rather than as gifts from God entrusted to my care?
- 2. When I face a difficult situation or loss, does my reaction reflect an owner who has lost something, or a steward trusting the ultimate owner?
- 3. What are my unique talents, abilities, and life experiences, and where might God be calling me to use them for the good of others in my community or church?
- 4. If my highest calling is to reflect God's character and represent his sovereign rule, what specific area of my life needs the most alignment with that purpose right now?
- 5. What is one practical step I can take this week to live more like a faithful manager and less like a selfish owner?

It has been a long time since I preached in the book of Genesis because I never preached in the book of Genesis because it is an easy book of the bible that is the book of the bible that talks about him as the creator of life and everything on earth.

"Then God said, "Let us make mankind in our image, in our likeness, so that they may rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky, over the livestock and all the wild animals, and over all the creatures that move along the ground. So God created mankind in his own image, in the image of God he created them; male and female he created them. God blessed them and said to them, "Be fruitful and increase in number; fill the earth and subdue it. Rule over the fish in the sea and the birds in the sky and over every living creature that moves on the ground."-Genesis 1:26-28

Humans are made in God's image. That's why I say we need to be happy for who we are and on the day you were born. There is no need to have transgender surgery to have a sex change. Tell the person next to you to be proud of who you are. We must like who we are in the world on the day we were born. God's representative rulers or stewards of his creation. This passage suggests a relationship between God and humanity where humans are called to reflect God's character and purpose on Earth.

James and John through their mother ask Jesus to let them sit on His right and left hand in His kingdom. Jesus asks them if they are able to drink the cup that He is about to drink referring to his suffering. Jesus says they will indeed face persecution, but the positions are not his to give and reserved for those that have been prepared by the Father. The other ten disciples become angry with James and John showing there is still a competitive spirit among them. Jesus explains that true leadership in his kingdom is defined by service and humility. Jesus contrasts the authority of Gentile rulers with His own example of service. We need to prioritize the needs of others by helping the homelessness, needy, families and friends that are struggling. We need to act as a servant to others for people in need and dealing with homelessness. We need to live our life by following Jesus' example by making sacrifices to serve and worship God's kingdom. We need to modify our life to God and the Holy Spirit.

- Be willing to serve without needing praise or recognition
- Actively seek out opportunities to help others
- Rely on God's strength
- Live out your faith practically
